












In collaboration with Fermanagh & Omagh District Council's Climate Change and Sustainable Development team, we have been successful in securing almost £271,000 funding to deliver a Cross Border Peatlands Scoping Project.

The project, which has been funded by the NIEA through the Shared Island Peatlands Challenge Fund, aims to enhance opportunities for peatland restoration within Fermanagh & Omagh District Council and Cavan County Council areas. Three specific areas of blanket bog focus have been selected Gortin Lakes, Cuilcagh Mountain and Cuilcagh Anierin within West Fermanagh and West Cavan.

Baseline scientific surveys will be carried out to identify restoration opportunities. This information will be used to create Peatland Restoration Plans for each site and will include ongoing scientific monitoring.

The site at Gortin Lakes will be developed as a peatland restoration demonstration site allowing the piloting and sharing of knowledge to a range of stakeholders and contractors on peatland restoration techniques. Community engagement and the development of citizen science, volunteering and peatland educational programme will also be undertaken on a cross-border basis. This will help to encourage skills development and raise awareness of the importance of our peatlands.

The project is being delivered in partnership with Fermanagh & Omagh District Council, Cavan County Council, NIEA, National Parks & Wildlife Service and Coillte.

#### **Shared Island Civic Society Fund**

Cuilcagh Lakelands Geopark, in partnership with Ballyhoura Development Group, have been awarded €31,964 funding for an Engaging Sustainable Tourism Communities Project. The project aims to facilitate cross border learning and sharing of best practice and promote collaboration through the development of sustainable crossborder civic relationships that can enhance tourism visibility and cooperation under the Fáilte Ireland Hidden Heartlands brand proposition for community and business beneficiaries.

#### **INTERREG Northern Periphery and Artic**

Cuilcagh Lakelands Geopark has been awarded €124,163 as part of a €1,2 million project, in partnership with Geocamp Iceland, Visit Reykjanes, Karelia University of Applied Sciences, Gold of Lapland Economic Association and Olemisen Balanssia ry. The three year Regenerative Tourism Project aims to build resilient communities and preserve unique heritage.

#### **Walking Trails Upgrade Works**

The Seán Éamoinn Ruairí Trail, commemorates the last generation of native speakers in Co Cavan, and particularly Seán Éamoinn Ruairí, who was born in 1849 in Legnagrow, in the foothills of Cuilcagh Mountain, where he spent his entire life. The site is a key provision for recreational access to West Cavan and Cuilcagh Lowlands, providing recreational long distance walking routes in this scenic area of the Geopark, for locals and visitors alike

The Cavan Way is situated in the centre of a great inland recreation area stretching from the Erne Lakes in Fermanagh to the North Leitrim Glens. The marked trail of the Way

extends for 26km from Blacklion to Dowra. It links up with the Ulster Way at Blacklion.

The Geopark in conjunction with Cavan Rural Recreation Officer recently secured funding of a combined €50,272 to carry out maintenance and upgrade works to these trails. With €40,272 coming from Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme and €10,000 from Department for Rural and Community Development's Walks Scheme which enabled us in partnership with local communities to carry out a number of improvements including;

installation of a number of stiles

- replacement and installation of finger posts
- installation of updated information panels
- installation of accessible benches

We hope you get an opportunity to get out and enjoy these trails in the months ahead.



#### Water Wheel Restored at Tully Mill Restaurant

Tully Mill Restaurant, located in Florencecourt, Co Fermanagh originally was the corn mill for the Florence Court estate in the 18th Century. The building was rescued from dereliction in 1998 by Killesher Community Development Association who converted the building into a restaurant, along with the construction of self-catering holiday cottages and a community centre.

Now part of our Regenerative

Tourism Business Network, the Restaurant is stunning, with an enchanting atmosphere, and serves delicious food.

Recently, the Killesher Community Development Association received funding from The National Lottery Fund. As part of this project the old water wheel at the Restaurant was restored which will see it generating electricity for the historic site. The restoration of the water wheel is not only important to the heritage of the area, but it also really adds to the unique atmosphere of Tully Mill Restaurant.
