

# Belleek Pottery Visitor Centre



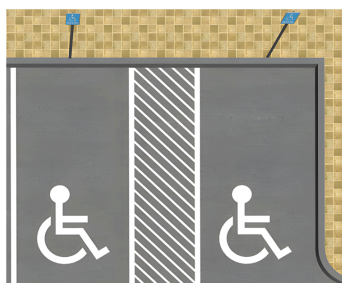
Know Before You Go Guide

We have lots of parking, including 6 bays of accessible parking close to the entrance. The main entrance has a ramp to enter the building.



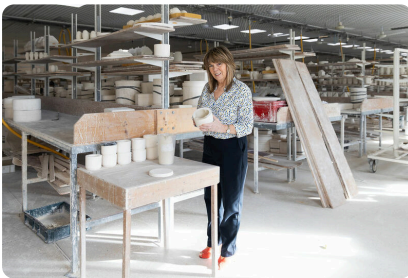
Inside, you can go to the showroom or Lily Annes Tea Rooms. Signs help you find your way around.

In the foyer, you can see our famous pottery piece. You can hang your coat and leave your umbrella safely while you visit.

We welcome families and have facilities for young children. We want to make visits easy for families. The Bloomfield Trail is a fun tour for children under 12. It tells the story of Belleek Pottery and lets kids find clues to complete the story.

Castle Caldwell Forest - An ancient woodland forest with 3 scenic walking trails on the shores of Lower Lough Erne.



Magho Cliffs - A hiking trail up to Lough Navar Forest, offering stunning views over Lower Lough Erne.



Castle Archdale Forest - A forest with 2 scenic walking trails on the shores of Lower Lough Erne and the remains of Castle Archdale.
