Know Before You Go Guide



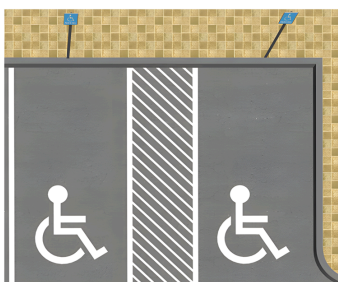
Corleggy Cheeses is located in Belturbet, Co Cavan. We craft handmade cheeses using raw milk and offer cheese-making classes. This guide will help you get ready for your visit.

To visit the farm, you need to make an appointment. As we are located in a rural area, it is best to have a car to get here.



There is a small carpark close to the entrance. You will be greeted on arrival.



Cheese-making classes take place in an accessible room via a levelled yard. The toilet facilities are not accessible. If you have questions about accessibility you can contact us via email.



You will be able to smell the milk from the parlour.



The taste of cheese changes from mild to nutty as it matures. We use vegetarian rennet to make our cheese.



There are only a maximum of 8 people per class. Making cheese is not a noisy process.



Sensory Tools in Nature



Corleggy Cheeses is surrounded by nature in a quiet countryside. Corleggy means "Little Windy Hill".



Stop and listen to the sounds around you. Hear the birds singing, and the wind moving through the trees.



Look at the trees and clouds in the sky. Can you spot shapes? It is calming to notice what's around you.

Corleggy Cheeses is a Member of Cuilcagh Lakelands Geopark's Business Sustainability Network.



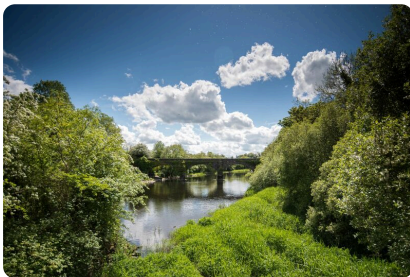
We use milk from our farm, reducing transport. Animals are grass-fed on local pastures, which is more natural and environmentally friendly.
