Know Before You Go Guides - Campaign Launch

Cuilcagh Lakelands Geopark has launched a new series of “Know Before You Go” Guides aimed at improving accessibility and enhancing the visitor experience across the region. Developed in partnership with our Regenerative Tourism Business Network, the initiative represents an important step towards creating a more inclusive destination for residents and visitors alike.

The first of 100 destination-wide guides were unveiled at a launch event at Blue Green Yonder on Castle Island, Enniskillen, attended by tourism businesses, community groups, accessibility advocates and public representatives.

Designed to support visitors with physical disabilities, sensory needs and neurodivergent conditions, the guides provide clear and practical information on attractions, trails, accommodation providers and visitor facilities throughout the Geopark. They include details on accessibility features, sensory considerations and site-specific information, enabling visitors to make informed decisions and plan their trips with greater confidence.

The project was inspired by the Geopark’s participation in the Divergently Together Project and responds to growing evidence that a lack of accessible information remains one of the biggest barriers to travel for many people.

As part of the Geopark’s wider commitment to regenerative tourism, the guides aim to reduce uncertainty, support independent travel and encourage more people to enjoy the region’s unique landscapes, heritage and outdoor experiences. The guides are available at www.cuilcaghlakelands.org.

Finland Visit Strengthens Regenerative Tourism Collaboration

During the meeting, Karan and Clarissa took part in workshops and collaborative sessions, exchanged best practice with international partners and explored local case studies showcasing regenerative tourism in action. The team also presented recent developments from Cuilcagh Lakelands Geopark and gained valuable insights into initiatives being delivered across partner destinations.

The INTERREG Regenerate Project supports regions in transitioning towards regenerative models of tourism and community development. Participation in the project continues to strengthen international partnerships and provides valuable learning opportunities that can be applied across Cuilcagh Lakelands Geopark, helping to build resilient communities and a sustainable visitor economy for the future.

Cavan County Council Partners In New Cross-Border UNESCO Network Connecting Heritage Sites Across Ireland

Cavan County Council, through Cuilcagh Lakelands Geopark, has joined an exciting new all-island partnership that will connect UNESCO-designated sites across Ireland for the first time. The UNESCO Together Project, funded through the PEACEPLUS Change Makers Programme, will be delivered over the next two years in partnership with Newry, Mourne and Down District Council and Mourne, Gullion, Strangford UNESCO Global Geopark. The project will officially be launched at an event on Wednesday 2 September 2026.

The initiative will establish a cross-border network linking UNESCO Global Geoparks, World Heritage Sites, Biosphere Reserves and Creative Cities, fostering greater collaboration through shared landscapes, heritage and culture. A key objective is the development of a strategic roadmap for long-term cooperation between UNESCO sites, including the exploration of a future UNESCO Tourism Trail.



Bringing together all 14 UNESCO sites across the island, along with six tentative UNESCO sites, the project will deliver workshops, community exchanges, creative programmes, environmental initiatives and cultural storytelling activities. UNESCO Together represents a valuable opportunity to celebrate Ireland's rich heritage, strengthen cross-border connections and support sustainable tourism, education and community development.

Stormont Event Showcases Northern Ireland's UNESCO Sites

Representatives from across Northern Ireland's UNESCO Network recently gathered at Stormont to celebrate the launch of the Our Special Places video series, a new initiative designed to raise awareness of the region's internationally recognised UNESCO designations.

The series includes a showcase film introducing Northern Ireland's five UNESCO designations, alongside individual short videos highlighting the unique character, global significance and local importance of each site. Featured locations include Cuilcagh Lakelands UNESCO Global Geopark, Mourne, Gullion, Strangford UNESCO Global Geopark, the Giant's Causeway UNESCO World Heritage Site, Belfast UNESCO City of Music and Gracehill UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Funded through the UK National Commission for UNESCO's Local to Global 2.0 Community Grants Scheme, the project highlights the important role UNESCO sites play in protecting heritage, supporting communities and promoting sustainable tourism.

The event also provided an opportunity to explore future opportunities for UNESCO recognition and collaboration, while showcasing the rich natural, cultural and creative heritage that makes these special places globally significant.

Shannon Pot Discovery Centre: Exciting Progress Continues

Sharing Knowledge on Peatland Restoration

In July, Cuilcagh Lakelands Geopark welcomed staff from Coillte for a visit focused on peatland restoration and partnership working. The day provided an opportunity to share updates on current and future restoration projects before heading out onto Cuilcagh to see successful restoration work in action.

Led by our Peatlands Engagement Officer, Roisin, the group explored areas where techniques implemented during the 1990s and early 2000s have helped restore and enhance valuable bog habitats. The visit encouraged knowledge sharing, discussion of best practice and strengthened collaboration between

partners supported through the Peatland Challenge Fund, NIEA and Shared Island initiatives.
