The Cuilcagh Lakelands Geopark team, wider Fermanagh and Omagh District Council team and Lough Navar Stakeholder Group continue to progress the Phase 2 Development Proposals for Lough Navar Forest which aims to sustainably develop the recreational, tourism and conservation experiences,

products and initiatives within the forest.

User and stakeholder engagement has taken place with 60 individuals, attending a public consultation event held in partnership with Derrygonnelly and District Partnership in June 2024, which has been critical to shaping and defining the proposals which



include the development of a new outdoor interpretation centre, toilets, outdoor learning space and approximately 4km of new recreational trails, aligned infrastructure and interpretation including 1.3km of accessible trail.

Get on your Bike to Explore Cuilcagh Lakelands Geopark!

Cuilcagh Lakelands Geopark is proving to be a huge hit for cyclists. Having launched the <u>Scarplands Trail</u>, the longest gravel cycle trail on the island of Ireland, earlier this year, we recently hosted a number of cycling events which has seen over 1,100 participants take on the challenge of the stunning landscape of west Fermanagh on two wheels! Thank you to the organisers, volunteers, participants, and the Geopark Communities for supporting the <u>Borderlands Cycle</u>, <u>FEARmanagh</u> and <u>Lakelander Gravel Grinder</u>.

For those of you who would like to enjoy the cycle trails of the Geopark with a little less exertion, you will be delighted to hear, in partnership with Killinagh Community Council, we have recently secured funding from Shared Island Community Climate Action Fund Strand 1a for e-bike charging stations at four sites across the Geopark. We look forward to commencing works on this project and will share further news on how to enjoy these new facilities in the coming months.
